PERSPECTIVES ON COMMERCIAL SPACEPORT INSURANCE TO MINIMIZE POTENTIAL LIABILITY RESULTING FROM A CATASTROPHIC LAUNCH FAILURE

Abstract

The catastrophic accident that detonated a SpaceX rocket during pre-launch tests at Cape Canaveral, Florida in 2016 and the explosion of an Antares rocket operated by Orbital ATK three seconds into launch at Virginia's Mid-Atlantic Regional Spaceport (MARS) in 2014 brought to light the importance of launch insurance and the disastrous consequences resulting from the failure of ensuring sufficient coverage. MARS suffered 15millionindamages and although Space Launch Complex 40at Cape Canaveral was damaged in the Space X explosion licensed spaceports and found that amajority either encountered difficulties in obtaining insurance for commercial launches.
