Abstract

Between August 2009 and September 2010, the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) conducted a competitive selection process with the purpose of establishing a Center of Excellence for Commercial Space Transportation (COE CST). The purpose of the COE CST is to help the Office of Commercial Space Transportation (AST) execute its dual mission through a dedicated university research program.
